Reading skills are critical for learning and childhood development, but sadly, many of today's children would rather watch television or play a video game than read a book. Getting your children to read can be a challenge, but with the use of quality children's books, it doesn't have to be an insurmountable one.

In our next issue, I will give you a few steps on how to support and encourage your child to read.

Homework

Homework improves your child's thinking and memory. It helps your child develop positive study skills and habits that will serve him or her well throughout life.

Homework encourages your child to use time wisely. It teaches your child to work independently.

Your child should be getting homework regularly, if this is not happening please let me know so that I can follow it up. Encourage your child to complete homework independently unless it requires your input. If a child finds the homework challenging or easy please inform the teacher by writing in the diary. It is important for the teacher to know whether the child has mastered the concept or not so that she can give appropriate support.


