How to support and encourage your child to;

1. Set aside a regular time to read to your children every day. Studies show that regularly reading out loud to children will produce significant gains in reading comprehension, vocabulary, and the decoding of words.

2. Surround your children with reading material.

Children with a large array of reading materials in their homes score higher on standardized tests. Tempt your kids to read by having a large supply of appealing books and magazines at their reading level.

3. Have a family reading time.

Establish a daily 10 to 20 minute time when everyone in the family reads together silently. Seeing you read will inspire your children to read. **More to come next week Diaries**

It is great to see many parents communicating through the diaries. I encourage all of us to check and sign our children's diaries on a daily basis. Some children deliberately hide their diaries from their parents as well as their teachers.

DID YOU KNOW?

The water cycle is an unending process. Water constantly moving around the sea, air and land.

1. The sun shines and the sea is heated.
2. Water evaporates in form of water vapour and forms clouds (Evaporation)
3. As vapour rises to cooler zones of the atmosphere, it condenses and falls again as rain droplets (precipitation).
4. When water reaches the ground, some of it does a surface runoff back into the sea rest and the rest infiltrate back to the water table that connects to the sea.


