Design & Technology

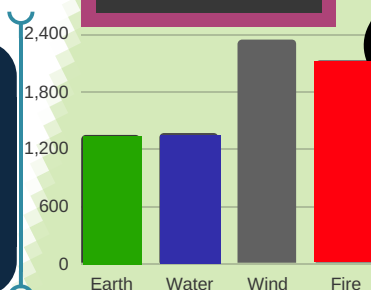

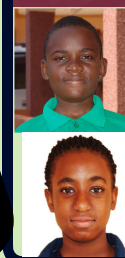
