Year 8 Science Experiment

Year 1
The Year 1 has been introduced to money. They excitedly talked about how much money had been saved in their piggy banks. This was an eye-opener when they discovered that in Uganda we use shillings, a dollar for the United States of America, pence, and pounds for the United Kingdom. Please encourage the children to keep saving.

Year 2
We took a glimpse at Winding in Design and Technology. The children were amazed at how continuous curved lines form a winding road. Children were also able to cut and paste small pieces of coloured paper on a blank white sheet to form curved and winding roads. Next week, we shall be looking at simple machines that use the winding technology to make work easier.

Year 3
The children have been learning how to write information texts in the non-fiction genre in English. They have been introduced to planning, writing genre specific vocabulary and features. Their knowledge of grammar, punctuation, and style is being enhanced. In Mathematics, children are learning time telling using both analog and digital clocks.

Year 4
Doubling and halving is the fairest of all in Maths. "Not even 1 is left behind." Year 4 found it as easy as ABC when doubling and halving even numbers this week. Then it slightly got trickier to halve odd numbers. How can we emphasize halving odd numbers?
*Round down 9 to the previous even number 8
*Halve it to 4
*Then halve the 1 left over to 1/2 or 0.5
*Finally, half of 9 is 4.5
Let us get down with it! Remember to make it challenging.

Year 5
It was an exciting week for the Year 5 children to explore the domestic and commercial uses of water. In English, we embarked on biographies and autobiographies. The children were thrilled by real-life stories of their parents as they interviewed them to write their biographies.

Year 6
The children have been learning about the different processes in Science how reversible and irreversible changes occur. They were tasked to make a 5-minute video about the filtration system and how it works. In addition, they were required to come up with a power point presentation on the different types of rocks.
